

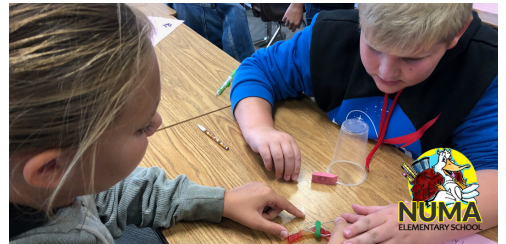


NJROTC SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS

 CCMS students were awarded funding from Envirolution's Project Recharge to switch out the 23-watt florescent lights in the sixth-grade building and replace them with 14-watt LEDs. 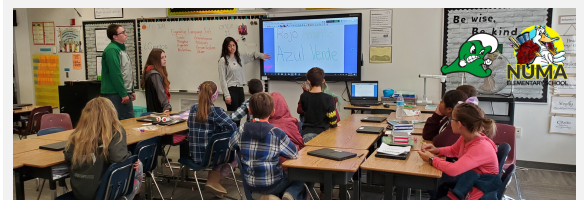
